Community Energy is a licensed renewable energy supplier with the Connecticut Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (“PURA”). Community Energy is proud to offer all Eversource and United Illuminating (“UI”) electric customers the option to purchase premium RECs through the nationally ranked, voluntary Connecticut Clean Energy Options Program.

A Renewable Energy Certificate (“REC”) is a market-based instrument that represents the property rights to the environmental attributes of renewable electricity generation. RECs are issued when one megawatt-hour (MWh) of electricity is generated and delivered to the electricity grid from a renewable energy resource. The purchase of RECs supports renewable electricity generation, which helps reduce conventional electricity generation in the region where the renewable generator is located.

According to the definition of Conn. Gen. Stat. Section 16-1(a)(20) a Class I resource from the New England Power Pool and the adjacent control areas of the New York Independent System Operator and the PJM Interconnection include those that are located in Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, and Connecticut; and the following states or the District of Columbia: Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia.
